



How to search for the right sized image on google:

Go to google, and type in the name of the picture you want. For my example, I used turkeys (yeah, I know, I seem obsessed with turkeys) and click on “Images”





Next, you will click on “tools” and then change it to “Large” size

Lastly, you will click on the thumbnail from the images to open a preview of the image in the right. Drag the image on the right to your desktop. Do NOT drag the thumbnail image to your computer. The image on the right is a large sized image (mine was 1240x698). The thumbnail on the left will be a small tiny image (generally about 260 x 180.) It will also be saved as “download.jpg” or sometimes “images.jpg” – that is the WRONG picture to use.



Sometimes the image won't drag a .jpg or .png to the desktop. In that case, take a screen shot of it. Right click on the image on the right and choose “Open image in new tab”. Then, use the Command + 4 option to make a box around the picture. The screen shot will appear on your desktop.
